- Graduate from the Global Institute for Governance and Sustainability Program;
 Be a current member in good standing of the Global Initiative for Governance and Sustainability, having signed the GIGS's Member Code of Conduct; Successfully pass the ESG.CD. examination; and
- Sign the EŚG.CD. Designation Agreement, which requires directors with to commit to a minimum of 14 hours ongoing governance and sustainability education annually.

USE OF THE ESG.CD. DESIGNATION

As a Member of the GIGS and a holder of the ESG.CD. designation, you have committed to achieving the highest standard of directorship.

The ESG.CD. represents a lifelong commitment to excellence in the boardroom, a desire to stay current, and to be a more effective director. With an ESG.CD, you are recognized as a director who can have more informed, focused and effective discussions. When used in board biographies or proxy circulars, it demonstrates to stakeholders the best-in-class governance and sustainability leadership capacity on your board(s).

The ESG.CD. should accompany your legacy designations, if any. ESG.CDs are encouraged to use their designation in the following circumstances and any others deemed appropriate:

- BUSINESS CARDS AND EMAIL SIGNATURE
 - Update your business card and e-signatures with the ESG.CD following your name and any other designations you may have, for example: JOHN SMITH, CPA, ESG.CD.
- OFFICIAL BIOS AND PROXY CIRCULARS
 - Include the ESG.CD in your personal and proxy bio with the following wording:
 - Long form: "[Your name] is a holder of the ESG Certified Director designation."
 - Short form: "[Your name], ESG Certified Director."
